The Fall 2015 AWA Membership Show Recap

Once again, AWA members have exceeded expectations with an amazing collection of wonderful paintings in a wide range of stylistic approaches. Over \$2,000 worth of prizes were awarded to a total of 16 artists. \$1,050 in cash went to the first five winners and Karen Riehm found another \$1,000 in Merchant awards. Here are the winners:

Nancy Herbst's Best of Show effort combines soft pastel color shifts with seemingly random splotches of color that look abstract up close and realistic from a short distance. She also used the background building's vanishing point to direct

attention to the center of interest then switches vanishing points at the curb line to lead your eye further into the painting. She also does all of our award certificates, so you can imagine her delight when she got the list this time!

It's interesting to see the difference in size and technique in the realistic Western Art submittals by Janet Mach Dutton and Carol McSweeney. Janet's large painting uses thousands of small strokes for very carefully blended surfaces. Carol, by contrast, makes her work look quick and easy. Diane Eide won for a loose floral sketch and John Erwin scored with a painting he'd done as a demo in class. In other words, there's no way to know what a juror will go for other than good work.

Participation certificates will be available at the next AWA shows for those who didn't pick them up when bringing or retrieving their artwork. **Also** watch for an article about the splitting of the Second Vice President job into four more manageable parts -VP, technical image manager, reception planner, and show manager. We are hoping

Bob Burridge and Bob-Land

Bob-Land is a special place that you can go. It is a magical place where you can paint without being judged or fear or failure. It is joyous and energetic and magical..... It is studying with Bob.

When I walked into his classroom, I knew not what to expect. I found a grinning man, dressed in black pants and a matching black tee shirt. There was a smudge of paint on his face, and he wore a well-loved apron.

"HI...I'M BOB..." as if I needed him to tell me. He came right up to me and shook my hand. "Glad to have you here..."

That's how my class began. Bob PLAYS at working. He loves what he does and it is apparent in every step of his well thought out class. We began with basic skills that everyone enjoyed. Bob gave us a word, and we had 60 seconds to depict that word (concept) on a small torn sheet of paper. Black paint only. We explored such concepts as joy, migration, calm.





I now use this every time I paint. Each morning, I begin my work time with five minutes of opening a thesaurus to a given page, pointing at a word, and drawing an interpretation of this word.

Bob showed us how to simplify difficult things – like drawing people. He explained that we needed to get the essence rather than the carbon copy of somebody. Gestures, perspectives, and light and darks made people and backgrounds meaningful and interesting.

He also showed us how to use both grey and neutral tones, and high colors. His color wheel is different from any I have studied, and really makes sense! If you get a chance to do so, investigate his color wheel. The colors are organized so that they blend,

contrast, and make interesting and balanced order to abstracted paintings.

Bob graciously shares everything he knows. Nothing is held back. He approaches each individual as an individual, and works accordingly. Each student comes out a winner in Bob's class.

Bob works in series. He explained why and how to do this. I took away a new appreciation for applying my topics in terms of several variations, and not just one flavor. Bob is very well known for his playful Circus Series. He always wanted to be a member of the big top, and so his work depicts just that. Circus clowns, actors, and animals. Colorful and whimsical, he paints smiles into the faces of all who look at these.

Bob and his lovely wife, Kate, do a lot of charity work. They paint with children who are terminally ill and also works with kids who are mentally challenged.

His five videos are remarkable and helpful. And if you sign up on his website, you will get a weekly BOB BLAST, to boost your spirits, and to make you just a little bit better artist.

I hope that you get to study with Bob. He is coming to AWA next October. Even though I am far away, I will fly down just to study with him again. It is worth the trip! -by Elle Gould
