this celebration of art.





"A-B-C" Corner (<u>A</u>rtist - <u>B</u>rush- <u>C</u>olor)

Artists and Their Sketchbooks: Does this make any difference at all? -by Elle Gould

This month, I have spent some considerable time pondering the question of sketchbooks, notebooks, and how some artists have used these throughout their lives.



When I first thought of keeping a sketchbook, I though, "UGH! One more thing to take time away from drawing and painting. " Yet when I began to get

into a rhythm and pace of sketching in a little notebook or a bigger book, I found myself feeling cheated when I couldn't do so.So I researched some of our most admired and even revered painters.

Michelangelo kept a meticulous sketchbook, and even used it to draw his shopping lists!! He noted thoughts and ideas as well as sketches. **Freda Kahlo** kept a "diary" with careful notations, thoughts, and sketches. **Kirchner** sketched some of his paintings before he painted these. You can see the comparatives

between his sketches and his final work. **Van Gogh** did meticulous sketches of his subjects, using pen and ink to express directions of movements in his paintings, as well as darks and lights. **Hopper** worked on his shades of light and dark, composition, and his thoughts about his future painting. Hopper's works are

beautifully composed. Is it no wonder if he worked out everything prior to his putting paint to canvas? **Leonardo da Vinci** made very intricate sketches of his "Last Supper". He worked out geometric positions of each


Supper". He worked out geometric positions of each disciple and their placement and movement.

We as artists seem to forget that art takes time. ART IS WORK as Milton Glaser says. The more we practice, the better we get. So should you keep a sketchbook? And how do you begin such an endeavor?

Danny Gregory, head of Sketchbook Skool, (an online sketchbook school) says to "paint before breakfast." I remember Larry Charles, a prominent



tromp d'oeil and super painter from Scottsdale Artists School, encouraged us to



paint several small paintings or sketches before breakfast. At the time, I thought, "Right. Before or after I throw in my first load of wash??" But now, I feel that Larry was absolutely correct. Morning is a great time to sketch. But so is before bedtime, or at a restaurant. Your own clock may dictate when you choose to make sketches of whatever you choose.

Charles Reid takes his sketchbook with him when he travels. He sketches and makes notes in the margins of what he sees. In fact, he has printed a copy of one of his sketchbooks, and this is simply called "Sketchbook" by Charles Reid.

I have found that Kath McCauley, a sketchbook artist from Tucson, has a wonderful way to begin sketchbook keeping. She makes it SIMPLE by carrying one pen, a very small sketchbook and a tiny set of paints with one brush. How simple is that?

"A-B-C" Corner (Artist - Brush- Color)...continued

A sketchbook can be a "scrapbook" of ideas. You can paste, paint, sketch, or experiment with your book. It is yours. There are NO RULES. You can have more than one going at a given time. (Don't we read more than one book at a time???

Well, I have made it one step simpler. I use a tiny little sketchbook, a miniature set of paints that a good friend gave to me, one brush pen and one ink pen. It is made by Art Toolkit, ands is the smallest I have found. It lives in my purse and the "brush pen" is always loaded with water. I can literally paint anywhere

Now it's up to you. There are online forums for sketchbook artists, and books to be read and studying to be done of the old masters and contemporary painters. I hope that this helps you. Please feel free to email me with your thoughts and questions. ellegould@me.com
