

#### "Art Is Its Own Reward"



"I feel privileged to be an artist. Art is, was, and will always be a great force in human existence. It is a reflection, after all, of ourselves and how we 'see' life. Artists are an enlightened species. The prerequisite for

being one is to have a passion to express feelings and to be willing to serve an honest apprenticeship. Regardless of what 'school of art' one identifies with, the artist never

graduates. Acquiring knowledge is a joy forever. I agree with Ben Shahn's observation ...'intuition in art is actually the result of prolonged tuition.'

The art of watercolor provides a means of expression for me that no other medium has.. Because of its magical,

elusive, spontaneous and transparent qualities, watercolor painting is always exciting, unpredictable, immediate, and challenging.



The reward for the life-long effort of artists is not in

material things. It is simply contentment." - *Mel Stabin*.

Mel Stabin is an internationally known teacher, author, and award-winning watercolorist. A graduate of Pratt Institute, Mel studied the art of watercolor with Edgar Whitney. For over thirty years Mel was an award-winning art director and



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creative director for major advertising agencies in New York City. He is a signature member of prestigious art societies including the American Watercolor Society, nation Watercolor Society, Transparent Watercolor Society of America, Watercolor West, North East Watercolor Society, Georgia Watercolor Society, and New Jersey Watercolor Society.

It is truly an honor to have Mel Stabin as the juror for the AWA's Spring 2016 Membership Exhibition and the instructor for both the 3-day and 1-day April workshops.

#### Critique Night for May Membership Meeting

Are you stuck?, unsure? or just looking for some helpful honest feedback on a painting? Then the May meeting has what you need!! Members are encouraged to bring one or two paintings (with a mat if possible) to the May meeting for *Critique Night!* This year's guest art critics are *Barbara Freedman* and *Diane Bykowski*. Here is a little background on each of these talented artists...

Educated in Michigan, Barbara Freedman earned her M.A. in Painting at Eastern Michigan University

and B.S. in Art Education at Wayne State University. After moving to Arizona Barbara taught painting in the Fine Arts Dept. at Glendale Community College for 6 years. She now works as a Juror, Speaker, and Workshop Demonstrator.

The past 18 years in AZ brought more success for Barbara as she earned signature membership in the National Watercolor Society, Western Federation of Watercolor Societies, and Arizona Watercolor Association. Her paintings are featured in books and magazines including The Creative Touch 3, Chris Unwin, and Best of Watercolor II, Betty Lou Schlemm. Competitive shows have honored Barbara with many awards including Best of Show, Awards of Excellence and Juror's Awards. Another highlight in her art career is her one person show at both Glendale Gallery, Glendale Community College, and the West Valley Museum of Art, Surprise, AZ.

When Barbara is not painting she can be seen golfing, gourmet cooking or traveling.

#### PERSONAL STATEMENT:

"Interactions with other artists and students will always remain a part of my growth. The content of my paintings are based on my personal response to my surroundings whether traveling or in my studio. Symbolic motifs are often used to represent my images, especially a ladder or houses. Since my visits to China & Japan the Pagoda has become a new symbol for some of my current paintings."

Our second critique artist is Diane Juris (D.J.) Bykowski who describes her work as "a reflection of me -



from the whimsical side of my personality to the sedate side where reality and dreams merge and come alive." Originally from Chicago, Diane and her husband moved to Arizona in 1984. Diane taught high school English for 42 years and for the last 12 years of her teaching career sponsored the art club on campus. Now retired, she spends much of her time volunteering with her trained therapy dog, Zoe; serving on the board of various organizations and expanding her art interests and skills.

Her versatility is apparent in her contemporary abstracts and traditional, almost nostalgic, rendering of a myriad of subjects as well as her original jewelry and wearable art.

Juried status in the Arizona Artists' Guild, Arizona Watercolor Association and the Arizona Art Alliance, along with active membership in Contemporary Watercolorists of Arizona, has brought her recognition and numerous awards.



Her animal portraits and commissions of that "special family member" are in high demand since she not only expresses the likeness of her subject but also its essence and soul. Much of her original work is also available as prints and cards. The work of D. J. Bykowski can be found in private and corporate collections.

Another excellent ending to the March AWA Membership workshop held on Saturday, March 12, 2016. Judy Magid's workshop on "Painting on Yupo with Alcohol Inks" was a big hit and was sold out.



Judy showed us all how to express our individual creativity while learning how to work on more slippery surfaces such as Yupo paper and on ceramic tiles. Judy does not draw first, instead she likes to experiment and create unique paintings.

Some of these paintings include landscapes, floral images and others end up being abstract.

She says the most important thing with her technique is to "have fun and to do what works best for you".

For some of the workshop participants, it was a new experience. Others just wanted to try to fine tune their craft.

Those that did not wear gloves just wanted to get their hands full of color and ink.

The best news was that if you did not like the results, you could take some 91% alcohol, rub it off and start again.

Thank you Judy for sharing your talent with us, helping us create wonderful art pieces and teaching us another method to paint with.

Looking forward to learning more from you. by Pam Root




