DYANNE LOCATI: A BOLD AND INOVATIVE ARTIST

I had the thrill of a lifetime yesterday when I visited Dyanne at her home and studio in Sun City West. Her home was an art Gallery in itself and her studio was resplendent with her art work on display and her tools of the trade. I was most impressed with her ability to put her hands on various items as we spoke about them. The explanations of her style and her work habits were meticulous. Dyanne stated that she was "always" interested in art. She thought perhaps she would go into interior design. This may have been the catalyst for her extensive art education. As I sit by the ocean (on the island of Kauai), I watch the paddle borders manipulate the waves, looking graceful as they catch a wave and follow it into the shore (well, some of them are graceful). I am studying them with a new viewing point, that is, using the principles of composition described by turn of the century author, Arthur Wesley Dow. Arthur Dow was inspired by Japanese art, especially the prolific Hiroshige Ando. In his book, he

suggests a number of exercises focusing first on line, then on notan (light and dark) and finally color. Photos of exercises pictured in his book remind me of the Polynesian art found so often here in Kauai. One of my favorite places Havaiki, a gallery featuring a world of Hawaiian, Polynesian, Melanesian & Oceanic art. Check out the website: https://www.havaikiart.com/

Each time I take a class or read a book is an opportunity for me to explore another style of art. Making art is about translating nature, not about transcribing it. Each of us finds our way of translating nature into art; some of us continue to experiment with a variety of techniques and styles; others find their 'style' more quickly. In your journey to discover your style, you have so many opportunities to explore different styles by taking one of the many workshops AWA offers. Consider taking a class...you may find a style that fits you well.

Back to the business of AWA. We are in the process of putting together a nominating committee to select officers for the upcoming year. AWA Community Outreach

Reaching out to You, the Member, and giving back to the Community

As you are probably well aware, the recipient of this year's Community Outreach is Frank Elementary School in Guadalupe. It is a school of approximately 500 students, K through 5, many of whom have the potential of being budding artists! One day some of them may even become a member of AWA. A fantasy? NO. A possible reality? YES.

And, as you may be aware, visual arts, such as watercolor and water-media, are not strongly supported when tight budgets seem to reign.

To encourage these budding artists, AWA is accepting donations of art supplies that are appropriate to the 500 K through 5 age students and raising money for the art department to purchase specific supplies—mainly paint brushes and paint trays. Money is being raised in two ways: (1) by holding a great raffle at the May meeting and (2) by monetary donations collected at all meetings through May and for those AWA members who are unable to attend meetings by mail.

Donations of art supplies for the children may be brought to the meetings through May 10th.

The great raffle's prize is a choice of one two-day Juror's workshop to be held in the 2018-2019 AWA year The winner will get to chose between two two-day workshops held by artist Jean Pederson given in the fall of 2018 or between two two-day workshops to be held by artist Joyce Hicks in the spring of 2019. Tickets are one ticket for \$10 or three tickets for \$20. Only 300 tickets are being sold. You may purchase your ticket (s) at the General Meetings through May or by sending your request and check for \$10, \$20 or more along with a self addressed stamped envelope to Diane Parnitzke, 12712 S. 177th Ave, Goodyear, AZ 85338. Make all checks Payable to "Arizona Watercolor Association." Please write Community Outreach on the memo line. Please mark on the outside of your envelope, "AWA Community Outreach". Your ticket stub will be mailed back to you. You do not have to be present to win. For raffle requests by email - payment must be received by MAY 9th.

We are reaching out to members who are unable to attend meetings. Your mail in donations will be greatly appreciated. You may also purchase tickets by mail. If you win the Juror's Workshop and are unable to attend you can always gift it to a friend. Please follow the mailing guidelines given above.

"Paiting Portraits"~ Thank You Kim Johnson-Nechtman!

Attendees at the Saturday workshop with Kim Johnson-Nechtman learned many helpful tips for painting lively portraits. Kim shared freely with the group and offered many words of encouragement. Tips such as taking photos of your painting process to use as a guide for your artistic journey will help find areas in need of attention. Kim also emphasized using enough information in your drawing to guide you where transitions of shape and

light/shadow occur. She also uses red on the "warm areas' such as the nose, cheeks, fingers, toes, elbow, knees etc makes the painting come alive. Kim demonstrated how to avoid "mud" by her technique of just touching the paper with the brush loaded with color. No scrubbing back and forth! Then "once it's dry, you may reapply"! Color that is!

The day ended with a group critique and words of encouragement! The path for all of us to be our best creative selves includes (fearless) Practice, (regular) Painting and a Dedicated creative space (no matter the size)! Thank You Kim!

Michael Reardon Juror Workshop, APRIL 11-14, 2018



MICHAEL REARDON: "COLOR IN ARCHITECTUAL LANDSCAPES" Workshop Instructor & Juror for the AWA 2018 Spring Exhibition

"Ultimately, it is best to let watercolor be watercolor, allowing its transparent luminosity to shine." Michael Reardon

With this statement Michael Reardon gives permission to the artist to explore, learn, practice and enjoy the mastery of watercolor. He feels, "There is no other medium as magical and enjoyable as watercolor."

Michael states he was always interested in art. It was said of him, "Mike likes to color." He never had any formal art lessons until collage. He majored in architecture

and became interested in John Singer Sargent. He started to dabble in watercolor and had a few bad experiences but continued to strive in his ability. He became an architectural illustrator. His skills increased and developed as he continued to paint. It is some of these early experiences that he will highlight during the workshop.

Michael states that he likes to look for the pattern of light. It is this pattern that attracts him. The glancing or hitting of the light on objects in his painting that is of particular joy to him. Buildings in a landscape are ideal to him. Having the background of architecture, he is accurate in his perspective. "but, he never uses a ruler"!!

Michael feels that the beauty of watercolor is found in its inherent luminosity. He says watercolor will surprise ". He urges us to keep painting as much as possible. This is the only way to improve. He normally starts each workshop with a "day of painting greens," since one of his themes is landscape painting. In the second day he emphasizes focal points. Throughout the day he emphasizes composition and how to work from photos. He encourages each participant to take all four days but he will cover a lot of information in the 2 day workshop. He asks that students bring their own photos. He finds that the students paint better with information with which they are familiar.

Light and color are the two outstanding components of Michael Reardon's workshops. He is inspired by color with its "infinite array of hues" and with the reflectivity of light. The advent of this special workshop is exciting. He will hold the participants in awe. The allure of watercolor will be assured by the completion of his workshop. Art Show Kiosk Tent available for member use

AWA owns a ten foot square high quality tent suitable for use by members with up to date dues in art shows. This can be for use by a single member or small group. AWA charges just \$40 per use for a week or less.

The tent is relatively easy to set up and includes racks for displaying artwork. The original idea was to have

threemembers share the kiosk for a show and to have them hand out literature about AWA and to talk with potential members who attend the shows. They would also be demonstrating and selling their work.




