Thank You Michael Reardon!

April's Juror Workshop series was host to the delightful and talented Michael Reardon who shared his watercolor techniques to portray glowing light and rich shadow. Each day Michael guided participants through various landscape painting projects.

Each project began with a pencil sketch to help establish movement within the composition; create a foreground, middle ground and background; create four unique corners; and most importantly, to determine a focal point (a specific spot where the lightest and darkest values meet). Next, a value study using Paynes Gray to lay down the mid to dark values (4 through 10) of the composition.

Michael emphasized creating a link between the darks, where possible, to help the viewers eye move through the painting.

Finally, Michael demonstrated a full color painting using

his limited palette by beginning with an underpainting wash of Cobalt Blue and Permanent Orange . Once dry, he begins painting from the top down starting with his darks using Cobalt Blue mixed with either Quinacridone Burnt Orange or Quinacridone Burnt Scarlet. For a deeper dark, mix these colors with Ultramarine Blue instead of Cobalt.

For rich greens Michael used either Phthalo Green with Quin Burnt Scarlet and/ or Quin Burnt Orange or Carmine. Michael also emphasized using watercolors derived


from a single pigment (no

convenience mixes) to keep your color clean and luminous.

Each day concluded with a fun and informative group critique. Pencil sketches, value studies and luminous watercolor creations were all on display.

Did you know that you are automatically a member of the AZ Art Alliance?

AZ Art Alliance Basics

AWA is among the Arizona-based art groups that comprise the Art Alliance, a nonprofit organization, whose goals include: to provide member groups additional show venues; to promote the visual arts; to support art outreach programs that benefit military veterans, specialneeds individuals, and seniors. Each member group pays dues on behalf of its artists and appoints a representative to attend quarterly Alliance meetings (though the Alliance Board meets each month). Communications from the Alliance are sent to the AWA President and their Art Alliance Rep who passes the info onto AWA Members. By uniting with other groups to form the Art Alliance, our voice is stronger and we maximize the positive benefits that the visual arts can bring to the greater community. - Judy Delmonico-Roll, AZ Art Alliance Rep
