Watercolor unleashed—wet & wild! Paint a vibrant water scene in brilliant COLOR!

With a stunning waterfall or intimate woodsy creek as your model, study water in motion. In addition, learn to use "acrylic underpinnings" to set the stage for vibrant watercolors in your "waterscape" paintings. (The small amount of fluid acrylic necessary for this workshop will be provided.)

Techniques will be demonstrated to address the various puzzles with which the artist is faced when painting this stunning, fascinating and challenging subject. In this workshop, we will focus on:

- Cascading, splashing water
- Negative painting lessons
- · Acrylic Underpinnings (watercolor and acrylic)
- Simplified color theory "using color as value"

There will be demos, instruction at all levels, individual critique and lots of painting time. Class time will be structured, yet open enough to accommodate the artistic spirit within us all. All levels are welcome and encouraged to attend. The only prerequisite is an attitude of joy in the act of painting! Reference photo will be supplied, or you may use your own.

"The eye may see as a camera 'sees', but the mind's eye sees an altered, imagined image, what it wants and hopes to see. It's that illusive image, uniquely mine, along with a

heightened sense of 'realness' that I try to express in my paintings. This world of ours is often a frightening and mysterious place, but it is filled with scenes and subjects that excite my eye and imagination! The magical allure of the natural world,



and my reverence for it, compel me to attempt to capture its essence on canvas or paper."

Julie is the author of three North Light Books, Discover Oil Painting (2016), Watercolor Unleashed (2013) and Brilliant Color (oil & acrylic, 2009), plus nine videos for North Light/ArtistsNetwork.com. Additional publications

Personalizing Your Creativity

Personalizing your creativity will enable you to put your stamp on your original painting. This can be done in many different ways through your favorite colors, style, stamping and embellishments.

In this workshop you will be doing some smaller paintings using different items such as masking fluid, collaging with paper, mark making, molding paste and creating your own unique stamp. Materials for creating your stamp will be provided by the instructor, just bring something that you favor such as shoe sole with unique design, wire basket or raised image, etc. There will also be items to choose from to create your stamp(s).

By working small, you can experiment with several designs both traditional and non-objective. It will also allow you to see how the different materials work.

A relaxed and playful attitude will ensure a fun experience and great results!

Joyce Hicks states "I've always been able to see places and things in an idealistic way, but it wasn't until I discovered painting that I was able to express and interpret this personal view. Joyce is a member of numerous societies including Signature Member Status in the American Watercolor Society and past President of the Central Texas Watercolor Society.


In this workshop, participants will "transform ordinary places

CRITIQUE CORNER

How often have you been working on a painting and those voices start telling you everything that is wrong about it? Many writers are warning us that these days people believe whatever they want to believe. Too many of us believe the voices that are telling us what is wrong with our art.

How would you like to talk to a recognized artist who just wants to figure out what you are doing well and might be able to make suggestions about how to progress in your own way? We now have informal critiques before each meeting, just you and another artist or two who would like to have their work evaluated. Stop by and let's see how you are doing.

We can discuss paintings from the viewpoint of all the rules, like one-third points for your center of interest, touch a bit of the dominant color into the background and all that, but let's start with why you chose to do this particular painting and what would you like others to think about when they look at it. There are no final answers when it comes to art, but maybe the best artists have just learned to ask questions before they start. This is about learning how to look.

Drop by the front of the room half an hour before the start of the meeting and lets chat about your work!

AWA's Community Outreach—Giving to the Community By Reaching Out to Teachers

Arizona Watercolor Association's 2018-2019 Community Outreach program to Arizona teachers of art continues by reaching out to Peoria Unified School District this January. Thus far, twenty-four elementary school teachers have registered for the workshop; we do not yet have a number for the upper classes. The in-service workshop is designed to introduce and enlighten participants to techniques and skills used in watercolor and acrylic painting.

As of this writing, AWA member Candace Wilkinson has volunteered to give the workshop. Thank you Candace. We are looking for a volunteer to assist her in this endeavor. Please, consider becoming a part of this program.

AWA Community Outreach is looking for more volunteers to give in-service programs. The workshop itself is approximately two hours long. Set up and take down time is approximately two to three hours. AWA is supplying all the materials to be used by the participants in the workshops. A lesson plan is provided or you can use your own approved lesson plan. If you do not want to give the workshop but would like to help out with setting up and taking down, we would love to have you on our team.

AWA Community Outreach is also looking for a few volunteers to give a workshop for teachers of art, teaching basics in watercolor and water media painting. This workshop is tentatively set to be held at the AAG Building in May and/or the fall or spring of the 2019-2020 AWA year. It is open to any school teacher of art in Arizona on a first come, first serve basis.

Look for the Community Outreach table set up at each meeting to answer questions and accept donations to cover the cost of supplies. Please contribute to this very worthwhile outreach program.
