Suz Galloway

SATURDAY, MARCH 16, 2019 MEMBER WORKSHOP

The natural world is Suz Galloway's sanctuary. She says she is alternately regenerated and humbled by Nature's profound beauty, her complexity and her ruthlessness. In her art, she pays homage to this power by interpreting her glimpses into the natural world. To show diversity, Suz alternates techniques between tight renderings of nature with precise botanical work and wet-into-wet watercolor images that become almost abstract.

Suz's traditional watercolor work has been influenced by a lifetime of learning. She majored in art in college, studied in England, spent 30 years in retail merchandising, and owned her own art gallery. She has also had the opportunity to study under several outstanding watercolor artists including John Salminen, Barbara Nechis, Nita Engle, Cheng Khee Chee, Linda Baker and Stephen Quiller.

In the March workshop, Suz will guide us in a wet-intowet approach. She says, "A wet-into-wet approach to watercolor painting can be intimidating to some artists because one can't 'plan' everything that happens on the paper! However, it can also become an incredibly intuitive response to the medium which unlocks your inner voice and your ability to think more about what is happening on the paper than on the end result. That is the goal of this workshop!"

"As a group of artists, we will try to turn off our analytical minds so that our spontaneity shines through!

We will try to be willing to forget the details to focus on the larger areas of the painting! And we will try to accept what happens knowing that some of the most unexpected 'events' can create beautiful passages Hopefully we can make what we learn in this workshop about the painting process and the journey of painting...not the result!"

Suz will demonstrate how to begin on a full sheet wet-into-wet painting

in the morning and then, after lunch will re-wet the painting to complete it. Participants will use a half-sheet of paper and follow the same format.

Suz is a member of the Transparent Watercolor Society of America, Watercolor West, the American Society of Botanical Artists, and the Arizona Watercolor Association. She has Signature status in the Southwestern Watercolor Society and the Minnesota Watercolor Society and has served in several capacities on the Board of the Minnesota Watercolor Society. Her work has been juried into multiple regional and national competitions, the Eloise Butler Wildflower Garden Florilegium and the Minnesota Landscape Arboretum Flora and Fauna Illustrata. Currently, she is on the Faculty at the Minnetonka Center for the Arts in Minneapolis, teaches regional workshops and gives private lessons.

In this workshop, participants will "transform ordinary places into extraordinary scenes."



"A Taste of Watercolor"

AWA's Community Outreach-Giving to the Community by Reaching Out to Teachers

AWA Community Outreach presented an in-service introduction to watercolor/water-media techniques to teachers of art in the Peoria Unified School District. Dolly Maitzen introduced AWA to the attendees, Candace Wilkinson presented the program and Karen Gray helped with materials and took photographs. Diane Parnitzke was there to observe and circulated among the attendees, answering questions, giving encouragement and inviting them to AWA. Thank you Dolly, Candace and Karen for volunteering in this vital outreach.

AWA provides the materials used by the participants in the workshops. AWA does not charge participants or the districts for the programs.

The Community Outreach Committee is accepting donations of Arches 140# cold press watercolor paper torn or cut into 9 x 12 inch size pieces and tubes of red, blue and yellow primary watercolor paints. Pthalo Blue, Quinacridone Red and Cadmium Yellow mix to give wonderful colors of the spectrum but other blues, reds and yellows are welcome. Tubes of professional grade paints are gladly accepted, but student grade paints are just fine. We also need several boxes of white birthday candles (if there are such boxes) and white crayons along with a few bottles of "resist," spray bottles and scissors. To date \$294 has been raised for "A Taste of Watercolor". In addition we have received \$27, packages of Sharpies and some art items for Frank Elementary School. AWA Outreach is an ambitious program. Thank you AWA members for your generous donations toward reaching our goal of \$1,000.

We are are excited to report that Southern Arizona Watercolor Guild in Tucson under President Karyn Vampotic has joined us in a similar outreach in the Tucson area. We are in contact exchanging ideas and letting each other know which school districts are being worked with.

Look for the Community Outreach table set up at each meeting to answer questions and accept donations to cover the cost of supplies. Raffle tickets are also available. Please consider a contribution to this very worthwhile outreach program. It is a delight to be chairman of this very rewarding part of our organization. Once a year, art students are given the opportunity to submit images of their artwork for the possibility of obtaining a scholarship. AWA has joined the very successful program that AAG set up for the student application.

February 3rd we met at AAG to select the scholarships for this year. Six people were in attendance to select the students they felt deserved the scholarships. There were 30 applicants with 118 images to view. AAG was able to select seven artists for various scholarships.

Several students requested the AWA – Del Decil Scholarship which is designed for watermedia artists. I enjoyed seeing the artwork that currently is being produced by the students. Three of the applicants stood out as the winners of our scholarships. Each student will receive \$1,000. Toward their art career. Their artwork was excellent and fit the criteria set up by the AWA board... primarily watermedia on paper, canvas or board.

One student had watercolor portraits on paper. Another had watermedia paintings of people in a group setting. Then, one student was efficient in a more illustrative style. Each candidate had the approval of the group selecting this year winners. However the final decision is up to me.

Scholarships are given on behalf of the Del Decil endowment. Also, the AWA membership has given money to the fund by having a raffle table at each meeting. Donated items are given to be used for the raffle with 100% of the proceeds contributed to the scholarship fund. Please remember to donate items and participate in the raffle at the meetings.
