

### An URGENT President's Message!

Hopefully by September we can get together again. The virtual meetings are fun, but not the same as actually seeing each other. I enjoy seeing everyone and it is good to hear people to share time together.

I have to speak Openly and Honestly to all of you,

### AWA really NEEDS your help!

We need additional people to run the organization, it takes a community to make this work. Most of the board members have been serving for many years and we need others to come forward to help bring in new perspectives to the group. We also need to give all the current board members a break and give them some respite.

We still do many things the old way and we are working on getting more automations to minimize paper work and to stop keeping track of things manually.

### I must be frank, IF we do not get more help then we have only a few choices

- 1. CLOSE Down AWA permanently
- 2. Stop many of the functions like shows, workshops
- 3. Outsource things until we run out of money, which would take about 3 years.
- 4. Merge with another art organization (like AAG or AAA)
- 5. Get more volunteer help and keep going

I am hoping to get people to volunteer, I am happy to split up the work to make things easier

I want AWA to survive and I care about this community, but we need your help! **ASAP** 

We need all the help we can get.

We need someone soon to collect the mail every 2 weeks at the PO and make sure that any bills (which are few) get to the treasurer or to the workshop/show people if needed (but they should be sent directly to them, if people follow the forms), but some do not and forward membership renewal forms to membership chair.

We need a treasurer to update QuickBooks, takes about two hours a month.

We are working to automate all payments to online by EOY

Most the paperwork goes away then and committees can focus on the events rather than the paperwork.

We need a bookkeeper to write checks and send QB entries to treasurers, takes about two hours a month.

Once we automate, we can change our focus to what it should be:

Exhibitions could focus on getting locations, dates and judges, volunteers for setup/take down

Workshops could focus on getting people to attend and filling up spots so we can have more events

Membership can focus on getting new members and listening to member wishes so we can provide what members want

WFWS will needs to focus on our hosting the show in 2024, since this is a really large show, we need many people

Eblast could focus on getting feedback and surveys

Outreach start helping again, we can go back and help the Boys and Girls club probably in the Fall. Once we get a new President in Jan 2022, I will focus be responsible for Community Outreach

Tanya enjoys playing with paint---watching it mingle and move into luminescent backgrounds and shapes. She is passionate about color and light. She loves to capture the atmosphere of the sky with dramatic clouds. Other paintings are influenced from living overseas for many years.

In addition to dramatic skies and landscapes, Tanya is painting watercolor portraits and experimenting in acrylic and mixed media. She loves being challenged by new techniques and strives to learn more to share with her students.

Tanya has studied watercolor painting for the last nineteen years including classes from internationally recognized artist and teachers Ron Ranson, Alvaro Castagnet, Tom Lynch, Stan Miller, Mark Mehaffey, and Ron Stocke. She is a member of the Arizona Watercolor Association, Contemporary Watercolorists of Arizona, Vanguard Artists, and the Sun West Art Club.

Tanya's artwork has been juried into regional and open art shows. She's offered adult watercolor classes for more than 10 years. Her paintings have been accepted into the Western Federation of Watercolor Societies in San Diego CA, Arizona Watercolor Society, Arizona Art Alliance, Rochester Contemporary Art Center NY, Sun West Juried Art Show, Washington State Fine Art Show, Tacoma Maritime Museum, and others. Her works are in private collections and Tacoma General Hospital. Tanya has appeared on Washington Comcast television demonstrating her painting technique for dramatic skies.
