On short notice, she first presented a very well organized and thoughtful demonstration at the monthly meeting explaining her strategy for painting metallic and reflective surfaces. Then on Saturday at the full day workshop, Marion focused on portraiture. Her painting style is realistic, detail oriented, and always exquisite. The reference photo utilized during the workshop showed the strong play of light and shadow on the figure. Marion illustrated her process for color mixing to achieve a lustrous skin tone. Using layers of washes, she creates depth and modeling.



All the attendees appreciated her shared knowledge and rose to the challenge of trying to capture the image. Everyone enjoyed good food and good company during the process.

Advice from Nathan Fowkes:

" The reason landscape painting is consistently difficult is that we have a natural tendency to mostly notice and emphasize the contrasts while missing the big, simple relationships".

This painting started with just enough masking fluid to preserve important highlights. Then he applied an underpainting of vibrant warm colors. Next he applied darker washes, preserving the areas of backlit foliage. Finally he applies accents, some of them with gouache. Notice the blue-purple opaque qouache used to create a stronger sense of depth on the background rocks.
